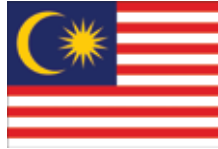

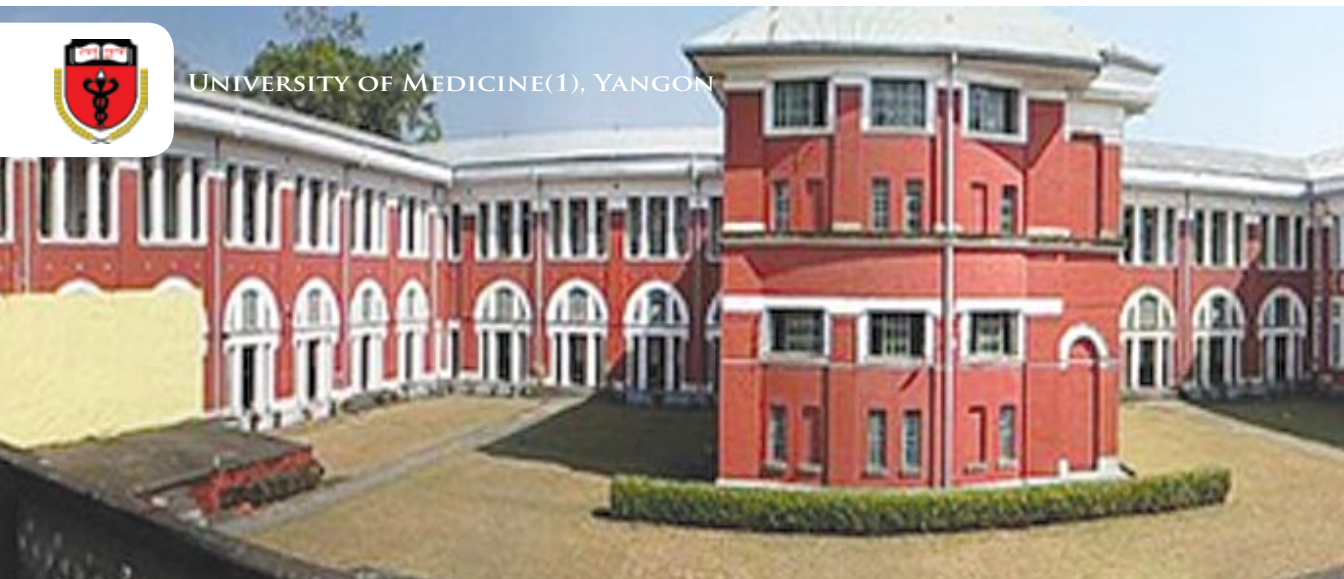

The University of Medicine (1), located in Yangon, is the oldest medical school in Myanmar. It was established in 1907. The university offers M.B.,B.S. (equivalent of the M.D.) degrees and graduate (diploma, master's and doctoral) degrees in medical science.[2] The university is perhaps the most selective university in the country, and admits approximately 600 students annually based solely on their college matriculation exam scores. There are three campuses: Lanmadaw campus (also known as St. John's), Pyay Road campus and Thaton Road campus. It is one of 3 schools in Myanmar recognized by the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates.

The objectives of the University of Medicine (1) are :

1. To acquire sound knowledge of the basic principles of medical science and the skills needed for the practical application in the field of promotive, preventive and curative medicine and research.
2. To be conversant with the knowledge, skills and attitude which from the foundation of solving the country's health problems.
3. To have a through knowledge of the health projects implemented according to the needs of the country.
4. To understand and implement skillfully the promotive, preventive, curative, and rehabilitative health measures and management procedures required by a basic doctor.
5. To be able to apply knowledge concerning Community Medicine as required at the primary health care level.
6. To be able to take the role of a teacher in Community Health Education and to give a leadership role in planning and implementing health programs for the patient, their families and the community.
7. To enhance self-improvement by pursuing Continuing Educational activities.
8. To be able to apply systematically modern scientific methods in the study and analysis of health problems.
9. To appreciate and accept the medical ethics required of every doctor and conduct accordingly.

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The University of Medicine, Mandalay began as a Branch Medical Faculty (BMF) of Yangon University in 1954, which in 1958 became the Faculty of Medicine, Mandalay. In 1964, it became an independent Institute of Medicine, Mandalay, offering an undergraduate M.B.,B.S. program to a class of 36 students. Graduate programs began in 1968 with a master's degree program in physiology. Today university now offers a number of graduate diploma, master's, and doctoral programs.

Aim

To produce basic doctors and highly qualified post-graduate clinicians and academicians.

Objectives

1. have acquired requisite knowledge, skills and attitudes for preventive, promotive, curative and rehabilitative health needs of the country.
2. be familiar with the National Health Programmes and be able to apply knowledge based on management science in the implementation of the health programmes.
3. be capable of identifying and solving health problems.
4. be capable of updating oneself by continuing education and research.
5. have the capability of adapting to the changing medical technology.
6. be capable of meeting the present as well as the future needs of the health care system and society's expectations.
7. have developed a holistic and humane attitude in dealing with patients.
8. be capable of appropriately applying matters relating to man and his environment in the field of health in line with the National Health Policy.
9. be familiar with medical ethics and observe and practice its codes.
10. have greater commitment to patriotic ideals and a spirit of altruism.

Hanoi Medical University, originally called Indochina Medical College, was founded in 1902.
