- Engagement of the ASEAN Medical Schools Network with the China Medical Board results in a pledge to fund AMSN activities till 2017
- ASEAN Medical Schools Network CHARTER creates the:
 - 1. ASEAN Medical Deans' Summit
 - 2. ASEAN Medical Schools Network
- On medical education in the ASEAN: Track students on agreed upon outcomes and subjecting these to predictive validity





SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS: DAY ONE

- Harmonization focus: Equivalence of curricular systems in Medical Education in the region
- Set standards through agreed upon accreditation systems
- Target harmonization of Medical Services in the region

DAY ONE Resolutions:

- I. The ASEAN Medical School Deans acknowledge and recognize the:
 - Authorization to use the name ASEAN as part of the ASEAN Medical School Network and the ASEAN Medical Deans' Summit.
 - Financial support of US\$55,000 of the China Medical Board for 2015 to 2017.
 - Association for Medical Education Accreditation (AMEAc), an autonomous entity based in Thailand as an accrediting agency for medical schools in ASEAN countries needing accreditation.
- II. The ASEAN Medical School Deans have:
 - Approved with revisions the charter of the ASEAN Medical School Network.
 - Agreed to work towards harmonizing qualifications to make educational programs comparable to allow greater mobility and exchange of professionals and students in the ASEAN region

ASEAN Medical Schools Network (AMSN) CHARTER*

Preamble

The ASEAN Medical Schools Network is a private, non-political, non-profit, volunteer, collaborative, academic organization that was founded to promote the highest standards of medical education in the Southeast Asian region thru collegial cooperation and effective exchange of best academic practices and information.

The purpose of the Association is to stimulate and develop the highest standards of medical education in the Southeast Asian region thru collegial cooperation and effective exchange of best academic practices and information. The purpose of the Association is to stimulate and develop co-operation between Medical Schools, Faculties and students in Southeast Asia and to develop their relations with other professional, governmental and non-governmental organizations in education, academic management, medical research and health care.

General Provisions

Name. The name of the organization shall be ASEAN Medical Schools Network. Southeast Asia shall also be considered as the region as defined by the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN).

Office. The Association shall establish an office at a site to be determined by the General Assembly.

Fiscal Year. The fiscal year shall be based on the calendar year.

ASEAN Medical Schools Network (AMSN) CHARTER*

Aims

The main aim of the AMSN shall be to promote the highest standards of medical education in the Southeast Asian region thru collegial cooperation and effective exchange of best academic practices and information. Towards this end, the AMMSEA/AMSN shall endeavor to:

- 1) Conduct regular meetings of the Executive committee/Office bearers and General Assembly and whenever required, special meetings.
- 2) Conduct regular academic conferences
- 3) Establish working groups and committees
- 4) Promote exchanges of faculty and students
- 5) Ensure quality assurance for the above activities
- 6) Establish and develop relations with other professional, governmental and non-governmental organizations in education, academic management, medical research and health care;

ASEAN Medical Schools Network (AMSN) CHARTER*

Membership

Acquisition of Membership

Membership shall be open to medical schools or colleges that offer a full course in instruction leading to a medical degree and are duly registered and recognized by the government in the Southeast Asian region where it is based.

Membership shall be classified according to the following:

- A. Charter Member shall refer to the medical schools that have participated in meetings and conferences since 2012.
- B. Regular Member—shall refer to medicals schools that join the Network after June 2015. A Regular member must be nominated by a Charter Member from the same country.

All members shall be represented at meetings of the Association by their respective Deans and/or their duly designated representatives
