THE HISTORY OF THE ASEAN MEDICAL SCHOOLS NETWORK (AMSN)

The ASEAN Medical Schools Network (AMSN) was established in 2012 to promote collaboration among the leading medical schools in the ASEAN region to achieve excellence in medical education and healthcare, share human resources, assist one another in capacity building in medical education and research, and to work as one community as part of the ASEAN Economic Community.

In a significant milestone for ASEAN, the 1st ASEAN Medical Deans' Summit (AMDS) marked the inaugural gathering of medical education leaders, including Deans and Rectors, from 10 nations: Thailand, Laos, Myanmar, Vietnam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore, and Brunei. The convergence took place at Siriraj, serving as a platform for sharing visions and collaborative ideas for the collective benefit of the 600 million people within the ASEAN community.

Subsequent Summits occurred in Malaysia in 2013, Singapore in 2014, the Philippines in 2015, Indonesia in 2016, Myanmar in 2017, Vietnam in 2018, and Brunei Darussalam in 2019. In 2020, the 9th meeting was hosted virtually by Siriraj Hospital, Mahidol University, adapting to the global travel restrictions imposed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Another virtual summit was hosted by Cambodia and Singapore in 2021. Face to face AMDS resumed in Laos in 2022 and then in Malaysia in 2023.

This year, the University of the Philippines Manila College of Medicine is, once again the host of the summit, showcasing the innovative curriculum, educational laboratories and extensive clinical and community exposure which characterize the quality medical education it provides.


